Stewardship 2021 - We Are an Offering

God's Word in the book of Proverbs offers a simple principle for honoring God with our money: *"Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce"* (Prov. 3:9). The principle of *first fruits* means giving back to God the first and best portion of what He has so generously given us. But too many Christians are in the habit of giving God leftovers. That is, making a gift out of the surplus remaining when all our needs and wants have been met. We know at a deep level that such giving requires no sacrifice, and does not honor the One who *"... did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all..."* (Romans 8:32).

The way to break the habit of giving leftovers is the biblical principle of percentage giving. The giving of a tithe (10%) begins in Genesis with Abraham and is taught throughout the Bible. If you can't see any way to begin at 10%, consider beginning at 3% or 5% of your income, then growing 1% each year until you reach 10%. Whatever percentage you prayerfully decide, make it the first item in your budget, not the last. Now you're honoring the Lord with the first fruits.

But the first gift that God desires is ourselves. Jesus said the greatest commandment is: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37). The first step of faithful stewardship is to give ourselves to the Lord who gave himself for us.
