As you prayerfully consider your financial support of Christ Presbyterian Church, I'd like to ask you a question: do you give out of duty or delight?

In the Book of Revelation (2:1-7), the church at Ephesus got a letter from Jesus. He commended them for their hard work, their endurance, and their refusal to tolerate immorality and false teaching. "But," said Jesus, "I have this against you, that you have *abandoned the love you* had at first." The warning is stern. The Lord even said he would remove their "lampstand" (His presence) if they did not repent and return to the love for Jesus they once had. They were scrupulously obedient, but their service to the Lord had become loveless; a duty instead of a delight. The lesson is simple. Jesus wants our hearts, not just our outward actions. Christ called his church to repent and "do the works you did at first." That is, love him first, and with our whole hearts, and all else will follow. Giving that pleases the Lord – whether of time, talent, or treasure - is all delight, not duty, because it grows out of love for Him.
