Rabbi Jesus

And [Jesus] taught in their synagogues, being glorified by all. And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read.

– Luke 4:15-16 (ESV)

Jesus is a rabbi, which means "my teacher." He taught the truth. The Greek imperfect tense of the verb taught (edidasken – he was teaching) indicates the central role that teaching played in the ministry of Jesus. Modern people are often more impressed by acts of compassion or ministries of "presence" than they are with the teaching of objective truth. The modern world prefers feelings over truth. But a good deed, even a miracle, can be misunderstood; and even if properly understood, may not evoke a commitment.

Teaching involves a word. A word is capable of greater precision and penetration than any subjective feeling. God created all things by His Word, and brought Israel into existence and sustained her through the words of the prophets. Jesus both *is* the Word of God and *declares* the Word of God, calling us to follow Him, and follow His teaching.

Truth without love can be harsh. Love without truth can be sentimental and morally lazy. Jesus came to us, as John's Gospel says, *full of grace and truth* (John 1:14). At the Mount of Transfiguration, the voice of God the Father said, "This is my beloved Son; *listen to him"* (Mark 9:7). Are we listening?
