#### Do Not Be Ashamed

Do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, who saved us and called us to a holy calling. – 2 Tim. 1:8-9

Why does Paul warn against being ashamed of the gospel? Because it's a trap into which we easily fall. It's easy to be ashamed of Jesus Christ, of the servants of Jesus Christ, and of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Here's why. Vague talk about religion, God, and spirituality is usually tolerated – even welcomed – in the modern world. What is offensive to modern (and ancient) society is a clear declaration that there is salvation in no one other than Jesus Christ. If we are prepared to declare with Peter that there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved (Acts 4:12), then we will surely face opposition. Paul's message to Timothy will be a message for us: share in suffering for the gospel.

Paul's invitation to suffering also runs counter to the Christian triumphalism of our day, which always speaks of Christian living in glowing terms, as if God will always smooth our path and lead us from victory to victory. Jesus, in contrast, was blunt and honest: A servant is not greater than his master. If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you (John 15:20). John Newton was right in his famous hymn Amazing Grace. A Christian must pass through "many dangers, toils and snares," before "grace will lead me home."

God has saved you, Christian, and he will hold you fast in the midst of suffering. God has called you, and his Holy Spirit will give you courage to testify to the truth of his gospel. When you are tempted to shrink back from standing for Christ, his servants, or his message, keep your eyes fixed on him, rely on his strength, and do not be ashamed.
